COLT STARTING (June 2 - 4)

This class is for horses that haven't been ridden or may have been ridden, but are still very green or have some problems that might be helped by restarting with a different approach. Joe will work with each horse individually, but the intent is to help riders prepare their horse and ride it themselves for the first time. Joe's ultimate goal is for each horse to be moving freely with a rider so they leave the clinic with a good foundation for further training. Tuition is \$600.00 per horse and rider.

HORSEMANSHIP (June 2 – 4)

This class focuses on building and refining the skills needed to advance riders toward their goals, whether on a ranch, on the trail, or in the show ring. Joe strives to help riders understand things from the horse's point of view. The class is geared to the individual needs of each horse and rider. Riders of all experience and disciplines are welcome. Tuition is \$500.00 per horse and rider.

COW WORK (June 2 - 4)

The emphasis in this class is on horse and rider teamwork, developing a horse that truly wants to work a cow and on using low-stress livestock handling techniques that pay off on the ranch and in the show ring. It is recommended riders have some previous cow work experience or have ridden with Joe before. Tuition is \$500.00 per horse and rider, plus cattle fee.

RANCH ROPING (June 5)

This special all-day class will start with groundwork and dummy practice, and then advance to cattle. Joe will cover shots and techniques needed for doctoring, branding and other day-to-day chores encountered on a working ranch. Riders must have ridden in Cow Work class to participate in this intensive one-day class. Tuition is \$200.00 per horse and rider, plus cattle fee.

Enrollment is limited in all classes and preregistration is required with a 50% deposit payable to Joe Wolter.

Cancellation policy: Deposits are non-refundable, but may be applied to a replacement rider or another Joe Wolter Clinic at a pre-approved date. In the unlikely event that this clinic is cancelled all deposits will be returned.

Additional Fees: A facility charge of \$50 per rider includes indoor and outdoor arenas and horse pens. Please bring your own water buckets and hay. Riders are responsible for cleaning their pens and picking up after their horses. Cattle fee for cow and roping classes will depend on the number of riders and will be determined just prior to the clinic. Both the facility and cattle fees are due at start of clinic and should be made payable to Patti Hudson.

Spectators: \$30/day - No reservations required. 4H/FFA youths, spouses of riders and parents of minor children riding in the clinic spectate at no charge. Riders enrolled in any class may spectate all other classes at no addition charge.
